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"ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT OF HOSTELLERS AND DAY-SCHOLARS OF SENIOR SECONDARY STUDENTS OF ALWAR DISTRICT – A COMPARATIVE STUDY"

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ABSTRACT

The purpose of study was to assess the differences in Hostellers and Day-scholars senior secondary students. A sample of 200 students (100 students from residential school including 50 boys and 50 girls, and 100 students from non-residential schools including 50 boys and 50 girls) was selected by stratified random sampling method. Students were selected from senior secondary of Alwar district. A Standardized Tool was used by Dr. A.K.P.Sinha and Dr. R.P.Singh. Results indicate that the academic achievement of Hostellers girls is greater than the boys' student of Hostellers and academic achievement Hostellers Girls is greater than the day-scholars Girls.

INTRODUCTION

In the words of John Dewey, "Education is the process of living through a continuous reconstruction of experiences. It is the development of all those capacities in the individual which enable him to control his environment and fulfill his possibilities. Sharma (2002) in his study he found that Parents of high achieving students often provided academic guidance to their children, planned cultural activities at home and the mean achievement scores of High parental involvement groups were higher than the mean achievement scores of low parental involvement groups.

- 1. To compare the level of Academic Achievement between girls and boys student of senior secondary level of Day- Scholars.
- 2. To compare the level of Academic Achievement between girls of senior secondary level of Hostellers and Day-Scholars.

HYPOTHESES

- 1. There is no significant difference in the level of Academic Achievement of girls and boys student of Day- Scholars.
- 2. There is no significant difference in the level of Academic Achievement of girls of senior secondary level of Hostellers and Day-Scholars.

METHODOLOGY

Sample

A sample of 200 students (100 students from residential school including 50 boys and 50 girls and 100 students from non-residential schools including 50 boys and 50 girls) was selected by stratified random sampling method.

Tool

A standardized Tool was used by Dr. A.K.P.Sinha and Dr. R.P.Singh [Adjustment inventory for school students (AISS)]



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STATISTICAL TECHNIQUES USED


Mean, Standard Deviation and 't' value is employed for this study.

RESULT'S AND DISCUSSION

1. Comparison of the overall Academic Achievement between girls and boys student of senior secondary level of Day-Scholars.

Graph 1: Comparison of the academic achievement between girls and boys of senior secondary level of Day-Scholars.



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
According to Table 1 and Graph 1 shows above, mean scores achieved by the Girls and Boys student of Hostellers are 72.29 and 66.00 respective. Since the calculated value of 't' i.e. is greater than tabulated value of 't' was not found significant at 0.05 and 0.01 levels. Therefore, the null hypothesis is rejected.

This concludes that overall academic achievement of girls is greater than the boys' student of Hostellers.

2. Comparison of the academic achievement of girls of senior secondary level of Hostellers and Day-Scholars.

Since the calculated value of 't' i.e. is greater than tabulated value of 't' was found not significant at 0.05 levels. Therefore, the null hypothesis is rejected.

This concludes that overall academic achievement of Hostellers Girls is greater than the day-scholars Girls.

CONCLUSION:

The study concludes that overall academic achievement of Hostellers girls is greater than the boys' student of Hostellers and academic achievement Hostellers Girls is greater than the day-scholars Girls.

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
